Todd Kettler is an assistant professor in the Department of Educational Psychology in the College of Education at the University of North Texas where he teaches courses in gifted education, creativity, and child development. He was a contributing author on *Using the Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts with Gifted and Advanced Learners* (Prufrock Press, 2013), and a co-author on *A Teacher's Guide to Using the Common Core State Standards with Gifted and Advanced Learners in English/Language Arts* (Prufrock Press, 2014). He earned his Ph.D in Educational Psychology from Baylor University, and he was recently honored with the Advocate of the Year award by the Texas Association for the Gifted/Talented. Dr. Kettler currently serves on the Texas Commissioner of Education's Advisory Council for Gifted Education in Texas, and he serves on the Texas Association for the Gifted/Talented Advocacy Committee. His work has appeared in *Gifted Child Quarterly*, *Gifted Child Today*, *Journal for the Education of the Gifted*, and *Journal of Advanced Academics*. In addition to his work as a teacher and researcher at the University of North Texas, he spent 17 years as an English teacher and gifted and talented program administrator.
